North Adelaide will begin its 2012 campaign this Saturday afternoon, being the only team to not play a trial game or have an official hit out the previous weekend. After a disappointing season in 2011, the Roosters will be keen to start this year off on a positive note.

In the lead up to the first up contest against the Panthers, coach Josh Francou put his charges through an intense three hour training session last Saturday morning. Looking for consistency across the entire game, the Roosters will be keen to learn from the mistakes of last year and not have ten or fifteen minute lapses prove costly toward the end result.

Just the one trial game victory against Sturt and losses to Norwood and Central will have Roosters fans apprehensive about how the side will kick the season off. North's opponents first up, South Adelaide, have started its official season with a pretty inconsistent performance across the two halves in their loss to West Adelaide.

A midfield boasting the likes of James Allan, James Bennett and Tim Delvins has the Roosters matching up well with the South on ball brigade of Nick Little, Joel Cross and former Rooster Toby Stribling.

The ruck battle between Daniel Currie / James Craig and Keegan Brooksby / Ben Dowdell will also be critical in terms of getting their respective midfield first look at the ball.

With the captaincy handed over to James Allan, former skipper Clint Alleway will look to have a big year in attack and with a forward line including the likes of Alleway, Johnny Boras, Sam Mayes and possibly the Crows listed Lewis Johnstone, the Roosters look to have too much firepower for the Panthers defensive unit to handle.

The Roosters should be too strong in this one, having too much firepower for the Panthers, which will again struggle to kick a winning score without the Ken Famer Medallist in the side. North to get their season off to a good start and claim the two points.

It's an epic encounter, not only due to the fact that of the past nine encounters between the two sides, the Panthers have not captured the 2 premierships on offer - with their best being a draw in round 4 of 2007 - but also in the context of the season. Well, it just HAS to be if South Adelaide is to avoid being suddenly seen as one of the competition's most vulnerable outfits.

And with the continued absence of spearhead Michael Wundke, due to an ongoing bout of osteitis pubis, the Panthers are facing an extremely tough task to get their season back on an even keel. Last week, Andrew Ainger looked as though he might provide the desired tonic up forward, but that look was fleeting - albeit promising.

The midfield brigade will again have to work overtime to nullify the influence of the Roosters' James' - namely Allen and Bennett - but the concerns are still there up forward with recruit Ben Casley not likely to front for at least another month, leaving the Panther forward line starved of height.

This void will have to be filled with an array of goals from the small forwards -including Rolfe and Daniel, while the on-ballers of Stribling, Little and co will need to ensure some pen-strokes in the goal column if the Panthers are to kick a winning score.

I'm going to take the Panthers on trust that last week was an awakening and not the catalyst for a rut of consecutive defeats!

CLUB REPORTERS PREVIEW

Sturt By Don Cooper

Round 2 is the first chance to see the new look Double Blues under the guidance of Seamus Maloney – and the much anticipated match against arch enemy Port Adelaide will take on even more importance as a barometer for Sturt's 2012 outlook following the Port Adelaide Magpies devastating win over the Eagles last Friday night.

As the first of ten home matches at Commander Centre Oval this season, the Blues will be looking to get off to a flyer and will need to set themselves for a bruising encounter.

That being the case, they will need to show not only vigour, but improved efficiency with their disposal from last year if they are to both win the hard ball and make it count on the scoreboard.

Josh Cubillo is the key protagonist in a Sturt victory for mine – and in recent times, feel his best has been untapped as a pinch hitter, rather than being empowered to lead from the front as a starting midfielder. His trademark aggression is exactly what the Double Blues need more of to be able to break the game open for their free running style. But just what changes coach Maloney has brought to the table in respect of tactics will be known more after 5pm on Saturday evening.

There is no doubt the Blues will have the capacity to match it in the centre square with the Magpies, with the likes of Jade Sheedy, Luke Crane and star recruit Ben Kane all capable of turning a game with class and skill.

Sturt's forward set up will be of particular interest, with Matthew Duldig needing to have a cornerstone season after showing glimpses of form throughout 2011. If he has a capable deputy inside 50, then the Double Blues could be well on their way to a solid year.

Have to tip with the head and not the heart though, but the match should be an absolute cracker!

Port by 17 points

Port Adelaide By Chris Kendall

After their round one victory, Port is being freely spruiked by many tipsters as being the real deal. The win really needs to be put into perspective, as Woodville/West Torrens looked flat and mentally absent in a timeslot they play rarely – night. Certainly Port were very impressive with their pace and willingness to take on the opponent, but with 23 rounds to go, coach Tony Bamford will still be keeping a very tight lid on proceedings at Alberton.

Exactly how Sturt turn out in this one will be a real mystery, in terms of game style. The glimpses we saw in the trials were very good in patches, but the minor round is a different story again, and new mentor Seamus Maloney is still making his imprint on a list that will take a little time to shake off the Luke Norman gameplan.

On paper, Port look to have an advantage in ruck, but that is selling Double Blue big man Angus Kurtze very short. After appearing to stall a little early in 2011, his last half of the season was back to the form that had him the most improved ruckman in the competition the year prior. James Miekeljohn and Adam Cockshell rotated very effectively against Craig Parry on Friday night, but Sturt will be more alert to this and will look to drag both players out wide where their influence can be minimised.

If Jeremy Clayton can hold the form from Friday night, which had him right back to his stellar 2006 season, Ryan McKenzie can get his hands on it at the stoppages and Callum Wilson and Luke Harder can combine for 8+ goals, then the task may get away from Sturt in this one.

CLUB REPORTERS PREVIEW

Central District By Phil Aspinall

Having shown some indifferent form throughout the trial game period, the Bulldogs begin the 2012 season against Norwood, a club they have recently formed a modern day rivalry with. After financing the appropriate upgrades to the lightning at Playford Alive Oval, Saturday evening's fixture will also see the much anticipated return of night football to Elizabeth.

As per usual the Bulldogs haven't exactly set the world on fire throughout the trials, with losses to Port and Glenelg and a close win over North Adelaide but, as was the case last season, the club is having to deal with a heavy injury toll and as a result of this, limited pre-season training and trial game time to some of the senior squad.

Coach Roy Laird doesn't use injuries as an excuse, admitting he has been disappointed with some of the performances in the trial games but he won't have a full list to pick from until the midway point of the season when long term injured players Alan Obst (knee), Brayden O'Hara (hip) and Cameron Milne (shoulder) have recovered and get some match fitness back.

There will be question marks on whether the Dogs will have enough potency in their forward line to counter a strong Norwood back six, which could well determine the final outcome of this game. Expectations will be high on Matthew Westhoff in attack for the home side but he is going need help from the smaller players for the Dogs to kick a winning score.

Central is likely to be without cult hero Jason 'Pumpa' Sutherland due to injury so a large work load will be expected of Jack Hannath who could find himself rucking against Power listed big man Brent Renouff. The Redlegs will be one club that will have a strong contingent of Crows and Power players to have to handle coming in and out of the SANFL and AFL in season 2012.

Norwood has added some exciting recruits to their line-up, including forward line potency through the likes of Michael Newton, Ben Warren and crumber Nathan Batsanis, so the Bulldogs defenders will certainly have their hands full on the night. Returning veteran Yves Sibenaler and new recruit Tom Collier seem the likely match ups for the Legs' two key forwards.

It takes a brave man to tip against Central on their home soil, especially when they have won the last 10 contests against the Legs at home, but with poor trial game form and injuries again having a say at the selection table, the Dogs seem to be ripe for the picking early on.

Great to see night football return to Elizabeth, although there are still not nearly enough games staged at one of the best SANFL venues at night this year.

Both teams kick off their 2012 campaigns here and given some of their stellar battles over the last few years, there is plenty to look forward to in this one. How the prize ex-AFL recruits perform for each team – former Brisbane Lion Tom Collier for the Bulldogs and new Redleg and former Demon Michael Newton – will be a real key, particularly with the likelihood they will line up on each other at some point. Newton's high flying approach will be the light to the more shade, but highly effective leading style of former Panther Ben Warren in the goalsquare. How these two combine will go a long way toward determining the fortunes of Norwood this year, with the multi dimensional attack.

Despite the experience in defence such as new skipper Kieran McGuinness and emerging star Alexis Georgiou, there is still a slight doubt over the strength of Norwood's back six to contain a continually attacking team, and when Central get a run on at times, they can be devastating when their dimensions are all firing at once. If the Redlegs can be patient with building from the last line, then their ability to set the tempo is crucial toward them taking the points in the contest.

They do look a little vulnerable in ruck, with Brady Dawe and Angus Clarke tending to be more effective around the ground than in the actual tapwork, so if their onballers prepare to rove to losing rucks the majority of the time, they can still gain an ascendancy. Home ground advantage, however, coupled with the experience of the Bulldogs in these situations, lean toward Central starting 2012 on a winning note.

JACKMAN TO COACH BBH

A dentist by trade, former South Adelaide and Norwood league footballer Nick Jackman will coach the Booborowie-Burra-Hallett Rams in the North Eastern Football League competition for the 2012 campaign.

After two years as a player at the club Nick Jackman has been convinced to take on the coaching role with the Rams for the upcoming season.

Jackman was a key part of the Rams 2011 premiership success after arriving at the club at the start of 2010.

"I think the beauty of this role and the senior group we have at the club, I'm just in this role for a bit of guidance," Jackman explained.

"I will be using the experience of ('11 premiership coach) Danny (Schell) as much as I can.

"Having senior guys like the Boh Wall's and Casey Cooper's of the club, to help with the leadership will make my job easier.



"I will be putting a lot of faith in this pair to look after the training and commitments from a local perspective.

"Hopefully I can continue on the good work of Peter Whittlesea and Danny's over the past few years."

The 28-year-old confirmed that by taking on the coaching commitments he has relinquished any aspirations of returning to SANFL football.

After a late start to the 2011 season due to a knee injury, Jackman was an important part of the premiership glory and suggested his body was capable of more football instead of its usual September tiredness, because of his late beginning.

He also confirmed he will not be taking on the on-field leaders role at the club, handing this back to Cooper, a player Jackman believes is perfectly suited to this role.

After the clubs second win in three years since the breakthrough title in 2009, the BBH Rams are seen as one of the early favourites for the 2012 title, after a raft on signings and '11 captain-coach Daniel Schell committing to play at the club as a player.

It has been previously confirmed that Jackman's brother Matt, a former Eagles and Panthers SANFL footballer and the 2011 best and fairest, along with the Mann brothers, Stephen and Peter have resigned this year.

When quizzed about his coaching philosophies, Jackman said he had taken different bits and pieces for a variety of coach all the way back to his SAPSASA days.

"While I'd didn't actually play under Nathan Bassett I was impressed with the way he went about his business, during the pre-season I was at the Redlegs," Jackman continued.

"Country football is quickly developing a lot of aspects we were using in the SANFL a couple of years back.

"We have a great foundation at BBH and my role is to continue to build on that strong base."

Noted for his fairness and ball winning skills as a player, this is expected to permeate through Jackman's coaching.



HERZICK TO COACH GAWLER CENTRAL

The winds of change have moved quickly at the Gawler Central Football Club.

One of the assistant coaches under Craig Dawe last year, Damien Herzick is the new senior coach of the Tigers for 2012, on the last day of October. Previously Herzick had been senior coach at the South Gawler Lions from 2006 to 2009.

Last year he was an assistant helping out friend Matthew Gallerello at Elizabeth in the Amateur League.

"It has been a dramatic couple of days," Herzick, who received the confirmation phone call 72 hours after he first discussed the role, said.

"The first chat I had about the position was last Thursday afternoon.

"I've already made upwards of 30 phone calls to players and prospective assistants since Monday arvo.

"There is a lot of work ahead in the next month."

Herzick played the majority of his junior football at the Port Adelaide Magpies through to reserves level and then spent five years at Salisbury North, both being captain and coach of that club.

Noted as a strong mark full forward, Herzick's best haul was 112 goals in the 1996 season and he was leading goal kicker at the Hawks through each of his five years at the club.

He also played with the Lions in 2000, when he also led the clubs goal kicking tally.

"My coaching philosophies have changed over the years," Herzick, now 37, said.

"Naturally because I was a forward, it was predominately about attack, but they continued to evolve

"The modern game is about contested footy and turning defence into attack.

"One area I will focus on is the defence aspect of the way the Tigers play.

"There is a good talent base, and I was especially excited at a number of the lads in the senior colts group and a few who got their first chance at senior level this year."

"I'd like to make a special mention of the efforts of outgoing coach Craig Dawe, who brought me to this club.

"He has always had the best intention for Gawler Central at his heart.

"I suggested to the club that we go with a one-year deal to start and we'll look at this at the end of 2012."

Herzick is keen to ensure former Collingwood reserves footballer and Victorian cricketer Adam "Smudgie" Smith continues in an assistant's role at the club, after he has a significant impact during the 2011 campaign.

Gawler Central, who won the 2001 flag under Peter Vivian have been perennial preliminary finalists for the majority of the decade since.

Since 2000 the Tigers have played in the penultimate game of the season seven times, winning only once, in that flag winning winter.

Kybybolite junior from the South East of South Australia, 2009 Croweaters State under 18s captain and Melbourne Demon Jack Trengrove will become the youngest captain in AFL/VFL history when he leads his club onto Melbourne Cricket Ground against the Brisbane Lions on Saturday, March 31.

Trengrove turns 21 on September 2 this year and at the start of the 2012 campaign will have played 37 AFL games.

SANFL Talent Manager and his under 18s coach Brenton Phillips said that Trengrove was always destined to be a leader of men.

"I always believed he was something a bit special.

"From my perspective Jack is an excellent choice.

"When selecting leaders the first thing you look at is capability, as age is a secondary issue."

His coach at PAC Gary Jenkinson was even more glowing.

"Jack loves to work himself hard both on the training track and particularly in matches and that is why he is making his mark in the midfield,"

"He possesses a huge engine and will run hard for his teammates all match long, thriving in the modern game of Aussie Rules and he just loves playing with and for his mates.

"His pedigree and leadership was noted at PAC where he was a senior prefect, captain of the First XVIII (football) and captain of the First XI (cricket).

"Once a member of the South Australian under 15s cricket squad Jack, a stylish batsman that bowled handy mediums, toured England with the PAC 1st XI.

"He handles the spotlight with consummate ease and has been largely unaffected by all the media hype that has surrounded him since being drafted number two and now of course the captaincy.

This is the first time that a full round of pre-miership matches will be played on the 31st of March.

1984 saw the first matches for premiership points played in March; however only four out of the five matches were played on the 31st. West opened their premiership defence with a 7 point win over North the following day.

In 1986, a double header on Easter Monday to complete the first round of matches was held at Football Park between Glenelg/Norwood and Torrens/Woodville. Two days earlier, the other three matches were played on what is still the hottest day that premiership matches have been contested on (37.9 degrees celsius).

After Norwood and Central kicked off the 2001 season on Friday the 30th of March, the other three matches were held on the 31st. And the last time a match was played on the 31st of March was the season opener for 2006 between Glenelg and Norwood.

Thus, 10 matches have been played on the 31st of March. Glenelg are the only side to have played on all four occasions in 1984, 1986, 2001 and 2006.

North vs South:

Since 1991, North/South matches have produced more draws than any other combination (3 times).

Glenelg vs West:

Prior to last season, Glenelg and West had never met under lights for premiership points.

Sturt vs Port:

Despite not appearing in the finals series for the past few seasons, a win here by Port will see their best winning streak against Sturt since the 21 games won in succession by Port during 1989-Rd 1 1997.

Central vs Norwood:

The last first matches for Central after their losses in Grand Finals, saw a 123 point win against North in Round 1 2003, and a 7 goal win against their eventual GF opponents in 2007.

Central District have only lost one of their previous 17 home night matches - to North in Round 22 2006 by 2 points. Norwoods' only encounter against Central under lights at Elizabeth was in Round 3 2008. The 71 point win to the Dogs is their biggest winning margin under lights at home.
