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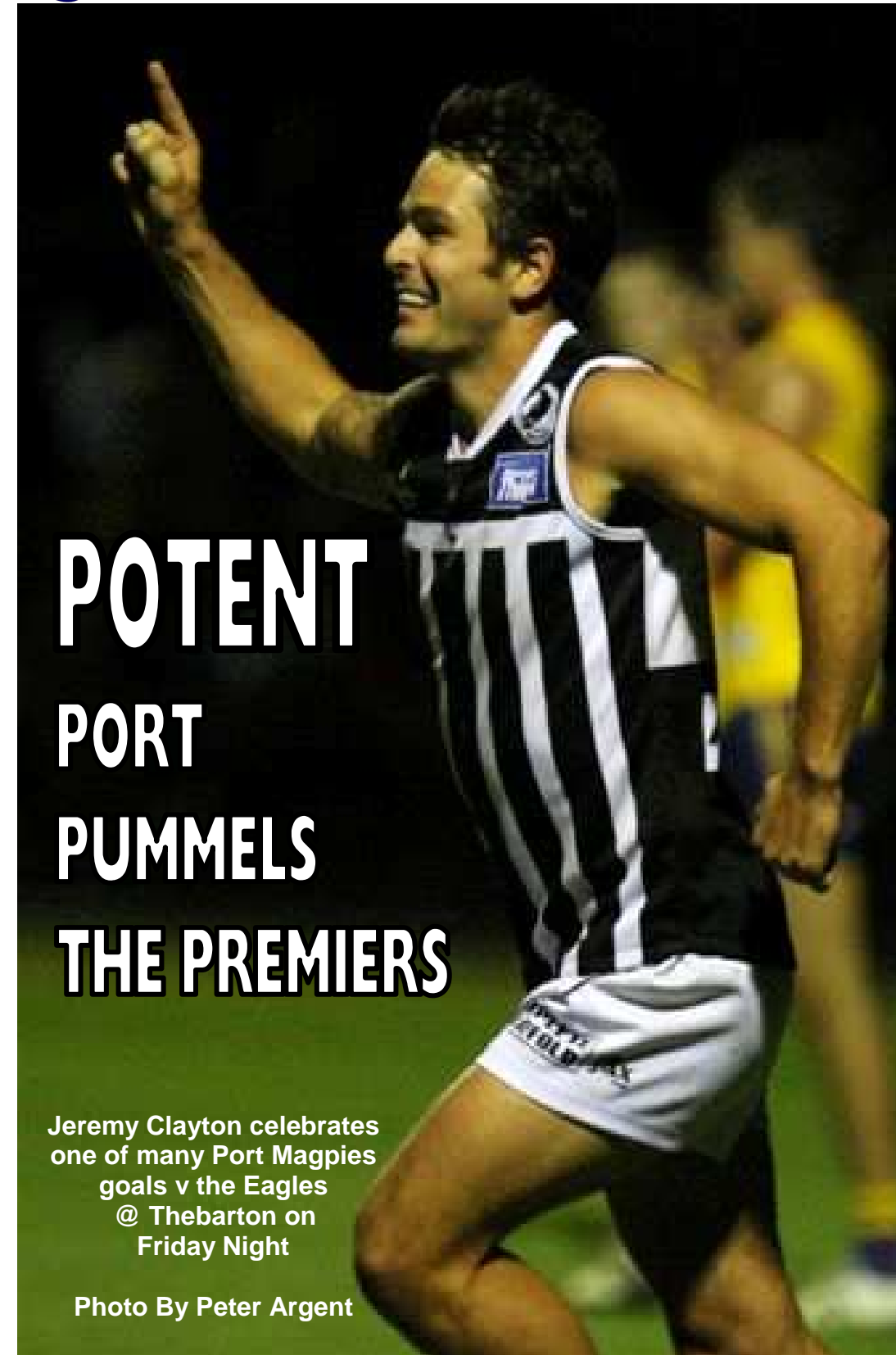

... and hopefully some of us can actually predict a winner.

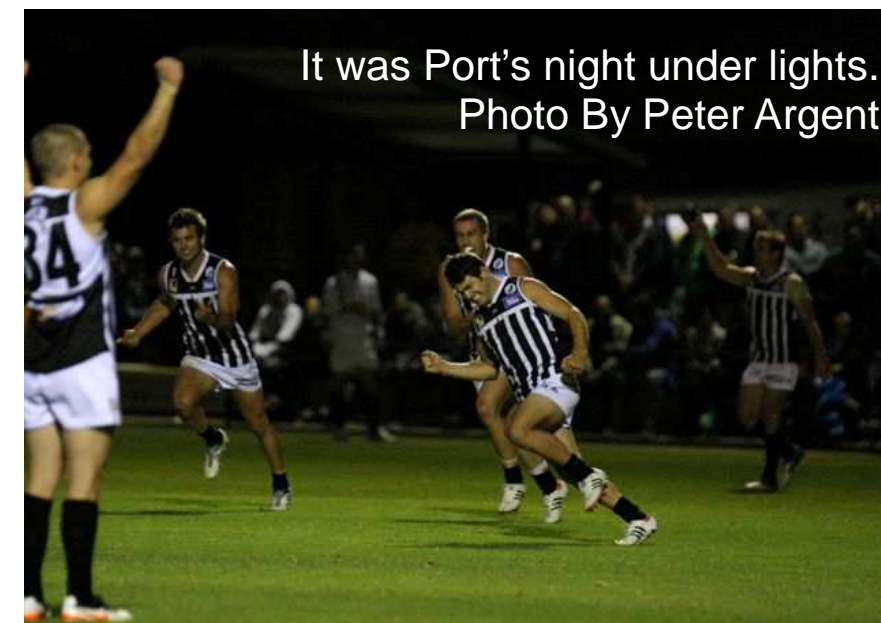
I would also like to welcome Kyle Smith to the FOOT-e TIMES SA team.

### KING FOR A DAY

At some stage during a SANFL match, nearly all of us have said a variation of that immortal phrase..”You know, if I was in charge of the SANFL, I’d.....” and then put forward our case for the things that we would like to see differently in the league. Some of these are borne of frustration at the time (“I’d put in another food stand so the half time line wasn’t so long”) and others are a real flight of fantasy (“When we win by 100 points, they oughta give us six points for that”).

Having been going to SANFL with family since 1975 (an apt year for a Norwood fan to start), it’s certainly a phrase I’ve uttered many times, but over time, you realise that these things aren’t that simple, particularly with economic rationalisation (a phrase that hadn’t crept in back in the heady 70’s) and a need to keep a majority happy in order to keep the turnstiles ticking over. Some things are quite sustainable, however, and might throw a different slant on things in the league. If the ultimate footy fan competition came along, and I was the winner of wearing Darren Chandler’s or even Leigh Whicker’s hat for a day, time to look over that fantasy Top Seven of things that I would love to see.

In making the list, I looked at lower cost proposals for the SANFL that bring the fans into things and make a day at the football just that bit more enjoyable in many cases.

**1. Two scoreboards at every ground.** This one seems, on paper, to be a minor thing, but with so many games now being played at night, at times it can be difficult to spot the score easily at some grounds.

Last Friday night at Thebarton, for example, was a double whammy. The scoreboard itself wasn’t lit with small floodlights and the only light present on it was a glowing green timeclock, which shone brightly over the line of vision to the score.

Electronic scoreboard are not always the answer, as seen at Richmond last year when their scoreboard broke down early in a game and spectators were guessing the score much of the night, or relying on a careful fan nearby with a pen and a Budget. A scoreboard at each end would make it a lot easier for fans overall, particularly if, for one reason or another, one scoreboard is not functioning properly.

**2. Numbers on the front of guernsies.** This one has gathered some momentum in AFL circles over the years, and has been part of the Under 18 competition for some time, but for some reason, is not adopted at senior level. The number of times “Who is number X?” was heard in the outer at both opening round games was amazing, and required, again, the kindly fan nearby with the Budget for many.

Seasoned AFL watchers, for example, recognised South’s Tim Houlihan (ex-West Coast) or new Eagle Robert Eddy, but it would have been considerably easier with the number on the front of the jumper also. Certainly a handy point for commentators also, it would also be easier for the umpires at times, particularly early in matches if referring to a player by name.

**3. Keep increasing the family friendly activities.** The way the SANFL, overall, has embraced families in the last 10 years in particular, has been nothing short of outstanding. The Family Friendly areas around the ground are well patronised at most clubs, the Auskick on the oval at half time and the regular activities at clubs have gone a long way toward keeping the next generation of fans coming through.

One thing that could be looked at, is giving younger fans more indepth tours of the various clubs, including, for a very short time pre-match, taking them into the rooms to see an element of the pre-match preparation for the seniors. Some of these youngsters will make the transition to senior football at one point, and if that 3-5 minutes gives them a spur to push themselves to take that next step, then our next football generation can only be the better for it. It also gives them a real chance to get up close and personal with their heroes in a manner the AFL would never consider giving.

**4. At each ground, exclusive “adult” areas.** We have Family Friendly areas at all grounds, and quite rightly, the area is kept completely free from inappropriate language and behaviour. So...why not a “Girls and Blokes Zone”, as far from the Family Friendly area as possible, where, by no means is inappropriate language and behaviour encouraged, but a place where fans under 18 are not permitted to enter and more rigorous banter is permitted among the fans.

A security presence – not an overwhelming or intimidatory one – would certainly be a prerequisite, but the time may be ripe for a zone where fans can really let their emotions out without fearing (sometimes justifiably) about offending younger fans.

5. A section of the Umpiring Academy that is dedicated to bringing former players through into the umpiring ranks. It has been correctly noted previously by officialdom that, after a lengthy career of training and playing at close to fully professional levels, the last thing many former players want to do is then devote themselves to learning a completely new side of the game from scratch.

This section of the Academy is aimed more at the 18-24 year olds who may reach reserves level and realise they are unlikely to make it to AFL or league level, but still want to retain a strong involvement in the game. The playing background is very handy for keeping a feel for the game, and is something that is missing in the vast majority of the current umpiring panel, through no fault of their own.

A concerted recruiting program commencing this season with a view to senior umpiring in mid-to-late 2013 could reap great benefits for a panel undergoing generational change.

6. An entirely fan voted Most Valuable Player award. We have the Magarey Medal, the R.O Shearman Medal (voted on by members of the 200 Club) and some media outlets have their Player Of The Year award, but the chance for the fans to vote on the SANFL's MVP.

Online voting would be the easiest method (once there have been measures put in place to minimise the possibility of multiple voting or vote tampering) and would give fans their chance to put their thoughts forward on the players they also see every week.

7. An Annual SANFL Lottery, with prizes including a trip to the Magarey Medal, with proceeds put back into junior development. The vast majority of fans will never have an opportunity to be a part of the SANFL's night of nights, and having been to a number of them, it is certainly a magical event that leaves a strong imprint each time.

While there are cost cutting measures in the league, a yearly lottery with a range of prizes, some donated by sponsors and one major component being "The Ultimate Fans Week" – with a trip to the Magarey Medal, a look behind the scenes on Grand Final Day, a boundary side seat at the big match etc. The funds from the lottery can then be ploughed back into the junior side of the game to benefit the next generation.

### WHAT WE LEARNT FROM ROUND 1

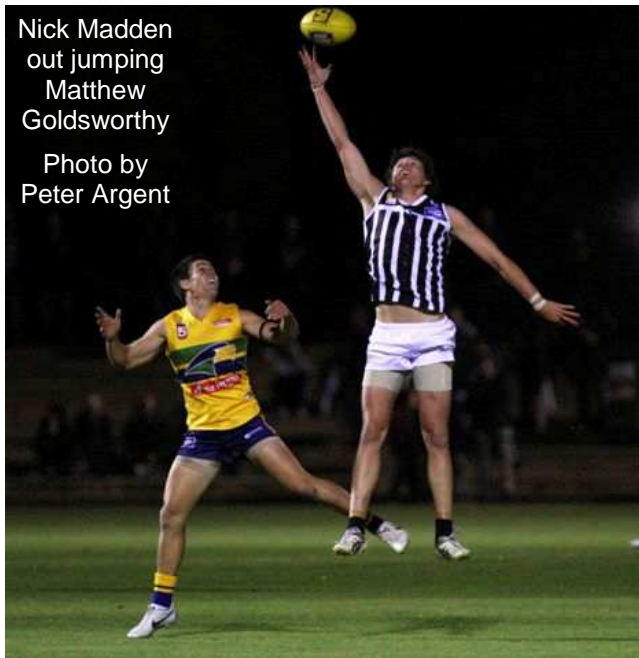
#### Peter Argent

Steve Summerton was creative across half forward and the season up north hasn't done Jeremy Clayton any harm.

- 3) The Eagles start to their title defence was much like the their banner – not many results were displayed from plenty of hard work. They are still four weeks away from being anywhere near their best.

- 4) Felt very strange with the season underway and no game on Saturday Afternoon.

- 1) The clubs need to keep an eye on the sound Systems: The opening night at Thebarton was otherwise very well run, but the sound system's failure to work during the National Anthem made for a jumbled start to festivities. The following night at Noarlunga, the music didn't cue up properly for the cheerleaders three times, before they gave up and did their routine at half time instead. Only a minor part of an otherwise entertaining opening round of SANFL,
- 2) The Magpies may have turned over their list at the right time. Late last season, coach Tony Bamford called time on the Port careers of a number of players who had been at the club for some time, but hadn't really cemented their league spot. There was disappointment from some members at the time, but the sheer pace of the Magpies on Friday night was impressive. With recruits Ryan McKenzie and Callum Wilson both having an impact – the latter more with defensive pressure than on the scoresheet – the early signs indicate that the regeneration of the Port list may have been long coming.
- 3) The traditionalists would have loved round one, because direct football was the key. Too often, football shifts in a long, winding path around the boundary before eventually making its way into the forward 50 at an acute angle. The Eagles spent large portions of Friday night skirting the boundary sides, and for the first half against South, West roamed far and wide with plenty of handball, getting nowhere fast. After half time, they played the same direct, down the middle football seen by Port all of Friday night, and reaped the rewards. Teams that played wide found themselves floundering all night, but going long and straight proved the most effective.

- 1) The Port Adelaide Magpies are a team on the rise. All the hype surrounding them through the trial period came to fruition last Friday night when they comfortably took care of the Reigning Premiers. The confidence Tony Bamford has instilled in his group looks to be contagious, selective recruiting and another year into the fringe players all leads to the Magpies being around the mark in 2012.
- 2) Consistency is the key. Being able to perform across four quarters is a challenge all clubs have but it is easier said than done. On Saturday night, we saw a tale of two halves at Noarlunga where South controlled the Bloods early and then after the main break, West just totally dominated the home side and showed some very good signs that supporters would like to see over the course of an entire game.
- 3) How much SANFL fans love their competition. Isn't it great to have the season here upon us and good to see 4,500 turn up to the opening game of the season at Thebby?

With more night footy on the cards in the next few rounds, we should see healthy numbers attending the games watching what will be an exciting brand of football.

- 1) Port Adelaide appear to be the real deal. I don't want to get too excited by just one performance, but the Magpies were fantastic. They dismantled the reigning premier with a clinical display of tough pressure football.
- 2) At nearly every contest there were three or four Black and White jumpers. The Eagles were just simply outmanned and outbustled all day. The particular pleasing thing for Port coach, Tony Bamford, was that this intensity was kept up for the full four quarters.
- 3) The game at Noarlunga once again taught me that you don't win football matches with one or two good quarters. South had a blistering first half, but were over run after half time by a more committed West Adelaide. It may only be round 1 but it is a tough loss for the Panthers; one I believe they will learn from.

1) The first thing we can take out of round one is that the SANFL is as hard and fast and physical as ever! The Port Adelaide Magpies showed us the standard they are prepared to set with their ferocity and intent on winning the hard ball and executing efficiently in the season opener.

Any side who takes another for granted in this key performance area at any stage of this season is going to rue it.

We saw that in both games, particularly with the Panthers on Saturday night – seemingly putting the cue in the rack at half time. Big mistake!! It's definitely going to be a very physical season!

## WEST d SOUTH @NOARLUNGA

- South's second half is the 180th occasion where a side has gone goalless after half time since 1899 (and only 54 after 1921)
- This is the 67th time out of the 180 that the side was leading at half time. Of those 67, 52 lost, 2 drew and 13 won.
- The 23 point half time deficit overcome by West is the 9th biggest by a side to also keep the opposition goalless after half time.
- The final scores of 12.9 to 5.13 are almost identical to the Round 21 2010 match between the sides at the same venue. West won 12.10 to 5.13.

## PORT d EAGLES @THEBARTON

- Starting with the 1899 premiers, the premier team has now had a 67-39-1 record in their opening match the following season.
- The 55 point margin represents the equal 4th highest loss by the reigning premiers for their opening match, behind:
  - 1995 - 92 point loss to Port vs Glenelg
  - 1935 - 74 pts to Glenelg vs North
  - 2011 - 66 pts to Central vs West (Rd 2, Rd 1 was a bye for Central)
  - 1981 - 55 pts to Port vs Glenelg
- All of the quarter scores by Eagles represent the lowest score at Thebarton up to that stage in the match (2, 27, 40 and 66 points)
- 16.11 (107) is the highest score conceded by Eagles up to three quarter time at Thebarton
