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SANFL LAUNCH GOES NOCTURNAL

Well here we are, just two nights from the start of the SANFL season.

"Night" being the key word, for the first time I can remember a SANFL round will be played with no daylight matches.

OK, there are only two games (more on that later) but the early story of 2012 will be the expansion of night football.

This week it's Thebarton Oval's new lights, the first ever night game played there for premiership points.

Then next week Glenelg lights up Gliderol Stadium against West and Central re-launch night footy at Elizabeth in a Bulldog blockbuster against Norwood.

This in addition to a second season of night games at Noarlunga, a third year at Richmond and also Norwood's traditional Friday Night Footy..

In the space of five years we have gone from only two grounds with lights (Norwood & Adelaide) to six. Given a wish for most clubs with lights to play prime night games early in the season, it will continue to be a challenge for the schedule makers to ensure everyone gets the matches they need to pay for their investment.

For four sets of supporters it all gets underway this weekend but was scheduling just two matches the right move by the SANFL especially with only one AFL game (Swans v Giants) on ?

Could a third game on the Saturday afternoon have given the SANFL an extra promotional edge with no

Crows or Power scheduled?

Of course a March 23rd start is the earliest since 2002, one necessitated by Foxtel Cup commitments.

Would the five clubs not playing be thankful that for them, what is already a long season wasn't extended for another week?

The fixture does give a rare chance for South and especially the Eagles to have pole position in hosting a big round one match, as West did for their lights launch v North at City Mazda Stadium in 2010.

There is also the issue of many ovals not being available for another week due to cricket commitments.

But I do feel for the Norwood, Glenelg, Central, Sturt and North fans who would feel like the party has started and they didn't get an invite.

Don't worry, Round Two will be here soon enough.

Also thanks for the great feedback to our pre-season issue. Like all new projects there are some early learnings and little glitches to work through but the hardest step is the first and we are off and running.

LIGHTS. CAMERAS .. SANFL GRAND FINAL 2012?

Cast your mind forward, if you will, to a balmy 25 degree Celsius October evening in 2012, to a place called AAMI Stadium. A place which has become inhabited by 38,000 plus frenzied football fans drawn to the ground like moths to its quartet of towering lights - camped on the edge of their seats awaiting the commencement of the ultimate match of the season. It's the SANFL Be Active League Grand Final – with only the 42 stars poised to take the field set to outshine the millions which flicker above in the night sky.

As dusk descends and the Reserves' premier completes its traditional lap of honour, the moon rises in time with the pre-match entertainment, which is gearing up to reach an electrifying crescendo. The flash of coloured lights swirling over the ground sends spotlights over each club's cheerleaders as they signal the imminent arrival of the two gladiatorial foes which

will fight to attain the Thomas Seymour Hill trophy by night's end.

The cracking sound of fireworks in the two clubs colours across the eastern grandstand welcomes the sides onto a superbly lit battlefield for this historic first night League Grand Final – and the start of a new era for SANFL footy.

So will the above foresight become football fact or fiction in 2012 – or even beyond?

Is it possible, or just a pipedream?

And while being a self confessed traditional tragic when it comes to my SANFL football, I can't help but wonder though, whether a move such as a night League Grand Final is just what is required to keep our brand moving into the future – and more importantly a successful future at that.

There is no doubt we have the infrastructure to deliver such an extravaganza style finale to our season, but do the powers that be see the same opportunity, or more to the point, are they prepared to make the bold move to venture into the unknown?

With the increase in popularity of night football in SANFL ranks, it surely must be a question of when, not if, we will see a nocturnal battle for the flag. So why wait?

On the back of a successful 2011 season which saw 20 after dark fixtures, 2012 will see a slight increase of minor round matches under artificial lighting to 22 (including the Good Friday twigh-light match at Hickinbotham Oval between South Adelaide and Sturt) – with the distinct point of difference being Thebarton Oval lighting up the start of Round One and the inclusion of Glenelg as the eighth League facility (including Adelaide Oval and AAMI) capable of lighting our game up under the night sky.

As a measure of the game's evening appeal, some 77,655 spun the turnstiles in support of a great night out watching SANFL footy last year at an average of 3,888 per match. That in itself is an outstanding response from the many who are then able to meet other sport or work commitments by day, while still being able to show their true colours by night.

And with the inclusion of lights at Glenelg, we can surely expect to see these numbers exponentially increase as thousands descend upon the beachside location to take in the footy adjacent to one of the best night time spots in our fair city - much akin to the lure of the Parade and its alfresco atmosphere which sees Coopers Stadium regularly host 5000 plus to its after dinner matches.

And a night SANFL League Grand Final would certainly create an entirely different atmosphere to the format which presently takes place, for spectators and players alike.

No longer would the Macca's Cup Under 18 sides need to arrive before the sparrows to commence the build up for their match, which currently takes its half-time break before the breakfast menu at the competition's major sponsor has even closed off!

A decidedly more civilised 1.35pm start would not only ensure young guns had the opportunity to properly prepare for the biggest match of their careers to date, but would also provide the opportunity for those outside the immediate family to journey along to see football's future stars strut their stuff - without needing to rise to the fear they had not put their clocks forward an hour and missed the start!

This would see the Reserves decider get underway at 4.30pm with the main event scheduled for a 7.40pm start.

And the SANFL would oblige both teams in a revolutionary way by providing the capacity for a post Premier's party along with an equally catered for area in which the vanquished club could drown its sorrows.

The support of the public transport industry – much like it does for New Year's Eve revellers – would amply accommodate those wishing to stay on and celebrate, or commiserate as appropriate and ensure safe travel back to their respective stomping grounds.

The following day, fans would congregate at their own venues for a reflective day at opposite ends of the emotional scale, but all would be afforded the opportunity to pay homage to their gallant warriors, whatever the result.

So, in my imagination at least, if it is so attractive to literally place our title decider under the spotlight, then what are the areas which may pose an issue for those who are yet to be convinced of the concept?

Well, I am keen to both hear and dispose of them, in the name of progress and seeing our brand, the SANFL, continue to keep itself at the head of innovation within the State League ranks.

How will sides prepare for a night Grand Final? Well, most of their training over the course of a season is done under the very same conditions, so how would that adversely affect any side?

What about the individual club's post match festivities? As mentioned earlier in this piece, that will be provided for at AAMI with the added capacity for each Grand Finalist to hold their respective family focussed events the following day, ensuring all supporters are catered for.

And what if the crowd doesn't turn up in support of such a venture? Well, quite simply, to coin a phrase from a famous movie inspired by an innovative dream, "if you build it, they will come." And if the SANFL take the step to stage their 2012 Be Active League Grand Final under lights, then they will be rewarded in ten thousand fold.....the tens of thousands who will flock to that place in time which will signal the new frontier of local football.

As it stands at the moment the SANFL Be Active League Grand Final attracts a far superior crowd to our bordering rivals. For example, last year 25,234 die hard fans turned up at AAMI Stadium to witness one of the greatest, heart-stopping Grand Finals in recent times compared to the relatively speckled support of 11,879 for the VFL decider at Etihad Stadium and a slighter larger attendance of 14,459 at Patersons Stadium for the title fight way out west in the WAFL. Given those figures, the SANFL Be Active League Grand Final was just 1,104 less than the sum of our two biggest rivals put together.

And that adds up to our product being the market leader, so herein lays a great chance for our competition to stand head and shoulders above our opposition by showing the way of the future before those around us move first.

For mine, it's a given that the SANFL should take the bold step of other great innovators before them and take a leap of faith into the future..... today.

It has been said before, "in order to accumulate, you have to speculate", so rather than kick around the pro's and con's too much for the sake of treading warily, let's make that strong lead when the match is there to be won and be first to the ball.

It could just well be the light bulb moment SA football has been waiting for to flick the switch on and clearly highlight our League as the best - and most forward thinking - State League competition.

So let's see the SANFL keep pace with the future and be the leader - not the lamenter of what might have been.

That's my view - and I'm sure I can look forward to yours in response!

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PANEL'S PRESEASON ROUNDTABLE

Question 1: What have you learned from the trial games so far?

Port Adelaide are flying at the moment and they will give the reigning premiers an awful fright in round one.

There are question marks about Woodville West Torrens fitness going into the season.

South and North supporters should have gained some confidence, if you can really read into anything from trial games, where players are rested or play a half.

Don Cooper

For mine, trial games amount to nothing from being able to judge where a team is at. It can be all smoke and mirror stuff from the coaching and playing group alike, but as long as the key elements are headed in the right direction, I think that's the most important component of trial matches.

No-one will see the real teams until they are put under pressure for premiership points. That's when it counts and when all the cards are laid on the table.

Up to this point in time, those cards are kept very close to the chest – and with good reason. It would be a bold person to call a side's bluff and read any form of substance out of the past few weeks.

They're all wearing their poker face to this point. Now it's time to up the ante and see what they've got!!

1) Some 20-25 years on I still miss the Escort / Foundation Cup pre-season games often played in the country.

2) We will all forget about the trial results as soon as we get to Round One (or Two).

3) Port Magpies are sending an early signal they plan to be the big improvers in 2012 and will be a good challenge for the Eagles on Friday Night

The Magpies should be one of the most improved teams in 2012. Having seen them live on a couple of occasions throughout the trials, they look to have improved in the areas that have let them down over the last couple of seasons.

Adam Cockshell brings to the club a quality back up in the ruck for skipper James Meiklejohn, while key forward recruit Callum Wilson should straighten the side up, now giving them the potency to kick a winning score on a regular basis.

I'm afraid to say it Bloods fans, but Andy Collins would have to be feeling the most pressure heading into the start of the new season. He starts his fifth season in charge at Richmond and season 2012 is surely a make or break year for Andy and his coaching tenure at City Mazda Stadium.

No doubting the great job that Collins has done in improving West from a regular cellar dweller but fans of the Red and Blacks have been starved on finals actions for close to a decade now. So, if the Bloods fail to get off to a positive start to the year, could we see a mid-season sacking?

Gee, that's a tough one.

There are a number of coaches who will be feeling the pressure on different levels about getting season 2012 off to a flyer.

But when all is said and done, I really wouldn't want to be sitting in Andy Collins' shoes for one minute.

There have been huge expectations on his side for a number of seasons now – and he has placed a large amount on himself. That's a difficult place to be, because should he walk away with a loss from the opening round against the Panthers – a result which I believe will come to fruition – it puts both him and his side right behind the eight ball in achieving what they need to place them in the hunt for finals.

The time is well and truly ripe for the Bloods to be back in September, and without this, Collins will be odds-on to depart at the end of 2012.

South haven't played consecutive finals series since 1992 and did only win 8 games last year but they appear a team on the rise.

Tigers went in the other direction last year and with massive player turnover the dust needs to settle before things can stabilise and once again improve. — Glenelg

Chris Kendall

Glenelg. Simply have lost too many key personnel, particularly in key positions, to seriously threaten again this year.

It will be a rebuilding year that the Tigers need, if they are to return to finals action in 2013 or 2014, but the short term pain will be worth the longer term gain as they build the right list.

John Nankivell

Glenelg. It's player losses have been massive, and while I like Massie and his enthusiasm he has a big job ahead of him making his young side competitive.

They won't be an easybeat and undoubtedly have some of the best young talent in the League, but with sides like Port and South improving I just can't see them featuring in the major round.

Port Adelaide is the side which most impressed – and frustrated – me last year. They have added some real depth and quality to their list and will be all the wiser for the wasted chances of 2011.

The last minor round match against the Eagles was a defining moment for the boys from Alberton as they now know how much it hurts to have, what you believe is yours, taken away from you. That won't sit well with them at all and you can expect to see the Magpies respond with the intensity which has been missing for some time.

If the defence can hold firm, then 12 wins is a real possibility and their pace could make life interesting for opposition teams at AAMI.

Port Adelaide. They were so close last year but just couldn't quite pull it off. Bamford is a hard nosed guy who isn't afraid of making the tough calls. I'm sure he won't be expecting anything less than Finals

With their younger group of players gaining more experience all the time, and some of their second tier players ready to step up, I believe this is the year the Magpies will return to senior action.

Question 7: Will any SANFL side get past Rd 1 of the Foxtel Cup this year?

Peter Argent

Maybe Port Adelaide – they have the biggest chance – especially when you see the draw.

Phil Aspinall

Yes, I certainly think that the participating SA sides all have a chance of some kind of Foxtel Cup success. Personally, I feel that the Magpies have the best chance to progress past the first round, taking on WAFL club Subiaco, here in Adelaide on home soil.

South Adelaide has a tough ask first up, playing strong VFL club Williamstown at the MCG while the Bloods don't get it much easier, heading over to Perth to take on Reigning WAFL Premiers Claremont. For mine, I think Port Adelaide will progress the furthest out of all SANFL clubs.

Don Cooper

With the benefit of a home ground advantage the Port Adelaide Magpies have the best chance of getting to the second round of the Foxtel Cup when they play WAFL Grand Finalist Subiaco at AAMI on April 7th.

The Bloods and the Panthers have much tougher assignments, but what a great opportunity for Ron Fuller and his charges to play on the hallowed turf of the MCG on May 12th prior to the Richmond v Sydney clash later in the afternoon! How serious any side is about this format is a question only they can answer, but if we can get one side through to represent our state, that would only be a positive.

Phil Herden

Probably not—Williamstown were the 2011 Foxtel Cup champions and they will be at home (MCG) against the Panthers, whilst Claremont, the dominant side in the WAFL in recent years host the Bloods.

That leaves the Port Magpies who do get a home game against 2011 WAFL Runner Up Subiaco. The Lions had an average season but surged through the knock out finals to get a crack at Claremont so they appear the weakest of the three opponents.

If Port can get past Subiaco they should be too good for the Morningside / Launceston winner and would find themselves in a semi final likely against Werribee or West Perth.
