The Senior Coach is responsible for leading and managing the development and implementation of The Club's Senior Football Programme, which includes:

- Coaching A Grade Players and the implementation of effective Game Plans
- Oversee the Senior Coaching Panel
- Foster the leadership capability and performance generally of players.
- Relationship Management across a diverse stakeholder group.
- Develop a Culture of Success with shared values.
- Promote the Club and its Brand.

Furthermore, The Senior Coach will plan and attend training sessions (pre-season and in season) and facilitate after match presentations to the playing group.

They will design skill development strategies and tactics for a variety of situations and opponents, and manage the implementation of the coaching program (including selection, match day and match reviews), plus recruitment, development and retention of players.

Candidates with AFL, SANFL or Div 1 experience will be highly considered.
